Passing the Pot to AFC

That’s right! For the month of June Congregation Or Chadash is collecting **pots** along with other various household items for AIDS Foundation of Chicago’s newest housing program; the Samartina Housing Project. *Honestly*, what did you think I was talking about?

The Samartina Housing Project is a collaborative venture between AFC and eleven other agencies, (e.g., Bonaventure House, the Haymarket Center, etc.), that offers housing to individuals living with HIV/AIDS who were formerly or recently homeless. Currently, the program houses nearly 50 individuals, and organizers project that another 55 will be housed by the end of 2010.

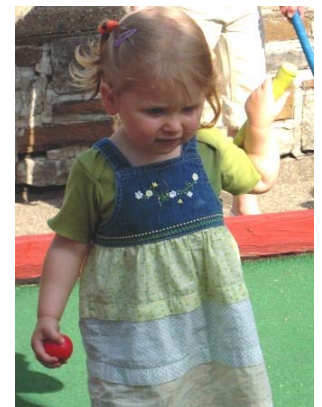
This is an amazing and heartwarming undertaking by AFC and its partners, but it not enough. Newly housed clients may have working ovens and appliances, but they do not

have pots and cooking utensils. Their rooms are furnished with mattresses, but they lack fitted linens and blankets.

From **June 4 to June 25**, we are asking congregants to bring in the following new or gently used items; pots, pans, bed linens, rags (all Sham-wows welcomed), cooking utensils and cleaning supplies. Collection boxes will be stationed by the OC information tables on Friday nights and all donations will be delivered to AFC offices once the drive has ended. In honor of Pride Month we would like to share this item read by Rabbi [Lisa] Edwards at services on the Shabbat before the Gala.

We are your gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender children:

“You must not seek vengeance, nor bear a grudge against the children of your people.”
[Lev.19:18]

We are your bi, trans, lesbian and gay parents:

“Revere your mother and your father, each one of you.” [19:3]

We are elderly lesbians, bisexuals, gay men and transgender people:

“You shall rise before the aged and show deference to the old.” [19:32]

We are the stranger:

“You shall not oppress the stranger.”
“You shall love the stranger as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.”
[19:34]

We are lesbians, gay, trans and bi Jews:

“You must not go about slandering your kin.” [19:16]

We are your trans, gay, bi and lesbian siblings:

“You shall not hate your brother or sister in your heart.” [19:17]

We are lesbian, gay, trans and bi victims of gay-bashing and murder:

“You may not stand by idly when your neighbor’s blood is being shed.” [19:16]

We are your bi, gay, trans and lesbian neighbors:

“You must not oppress your neighbor.”
[19:13]

“You must judge your neighbor justly.”
[19:15]

“You shall love your neighbor as you love yourself.” [19:18]

We will have read it at services, but here it is again.



A Prayer for California's Harvey Milk Day, every May 22

"Two days after I was elected I got a phone call and the voice was quite young and it was from Altoona PA and the person said 'thanks.'

And you've got to elect gay people so that that young child and thousands upon thousands like that child know that there's hope for a better world; there's hope for a better tomorrow... I know that you cannot live on hope alone but without it life is not worth living. And you and you and you gotta give 'em hope." [---Harvey Milk]

Eternal One, You created us *b'tzelem Elohim*, in Your image, filling us – as You are filled --- with hope, hope that we might yet bring to fruition Your vision of cooperation and harmony, of wholeness and peace. You imagined such a world, Holy One, and then instilled within us the ability to imagine it too. You hope even now for such a world, Holy One, knowing You created us with the desire to give each other hope like Yours, hope that tomorrow will find us finally ready, finally able, to bring Your imagined world into being.
