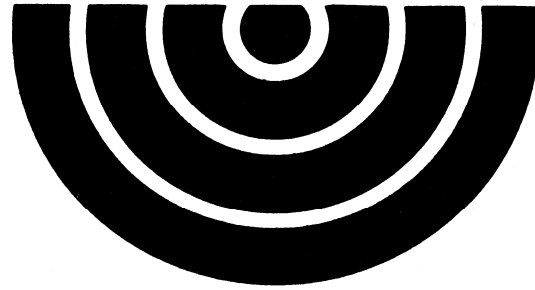

The New Light

My Holidays, My Families

Technically, I'm an only child. I have no siblings, but I grew up surrounded by a large group of close-knit cousins, and I loved spending time with them. Long before I understood the ritual and spiritual significance of Rosh Hashanah, I felt how special a time it was because we all gathered together. I loved the excitement of the arrivals and greetings, and the warmth of knowing we all belonged together.

Yom Kippur provided a quieter, more poignant memory. My father was never drawn to religious ritual or services, but every year he faithfully and lovingly said Yizkor for his father, and encouraged and welcomed my company. From the first year I sat next to him, I knew he was sharing something important with me and I came to equate Yom Kippur with this special father/daughter moment.

Later on when I was in college, Rosh Hashanah was my first homecoming of the school year. I hadn't been away long, but so much was packed into those weeks

and I couldn't wait to get home and tell my parents and family about everything I was doing and learning. Yom Kippur became a time to bond with my school friends. We would attend services together, share confidences during the breaks, and break the fast with pizza.

My father passed away on the first day of Rosh Hashanah during my senior year and holiday memories changed in a profound way. That year I said Yizkor for him instead of with him and from then on the Days of Awe brought a flood of mixed emotions. It became difficult for my mother and me to celebrate with others, so instead, we spent quiet time together talking and reminiscing. In time though, I began to crave the companionship and shared experience of the larger family and the Jewish community. It took a while, but eventually I made my way to Or Chadash.

Today, my cousins and I are scattered coast to coast, and many of us have families of our own.

World Congress

More than 120 of our fellow LGBT Jews, including some straight allies, from around the world met at the UCLA Hillel from August 13-15, 2010 for the 20th World Conference of GLBT Jews. From the OC, I, my lover Alan, President Bill, Rabbi Larry, and Social Action Chair Laurie attended. She was our delegate to the organization's Board, whose meeting was held two days prior. In addition, there were four other identified Chicagoans, which probably made us the largest non-Californian group.

In 5 seminars, 4 delicious included meals, 3 religious services, over 2 days, and 1 juggling, lesbian, Jewish comedienne, I believe most of the participants had a good time and believed they got their money's worth. I certainly feel I did. Of the seminars I attended, I valued the most a seminar about how to use writing as a tool for self-reflection, and one about the identity of "queer"/lesbian/LGBT/cisgendered Jewish womyn/en. If you want to hear more about those programs, talk to me.

At each of the four meals, there was an excellent speaker, each linked to the marriage fight in

California, each an out LGBT Jew. Elissa Barrett, Executive Director of the Progressive Jewish Alliance, spoke at the Friday night dinner, whose group was involved in *In Re Marriage Cases*, where the California Supreme Court invalidated Prop 22. At the Saturday lunch, Robin Tyler, an out comedienne in the '70s, spoke about her experiences with her wife as plaintiffs in *In Re Marriage Cases*. California State Senator Mark Leno, and recipient of the World Congress Leadership Awardee, spoke Saturday night about his influences and the political process in California. He introduced two marriage equality bills that Governor Schwarzenegger vetoed, but most recently and successfully, he introduced the Harvey Milk Day bill. Monday's lunch featured other people who briefly talked about their involvement and the work of the World Congress.

Though we as gay Jews are a minority of a minority, it was neat to see how much we can change the world. I was glad to hear about the accomplishments of our family and tribe members in California, but it was also good to know that we are active in Illinois. Two of the biggest Illinois civil rights groups are led by out, gay Jews: Jacob Meister, Executive Director of The Civil Rights Agenda, and Bernard Cherkasov, Executive Director of Equality Illinois.

Being minorities of minorities, I suppose it is natural for the number of conference attendees to be smaller. However, it is also a reminder that to survive, our organizations have our work cut out for us if we are to continue.

The High Holidays are a special time of the year at Or Chadash. Beginning with Selichot through Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and culminating with Hakafot for Simchat Torah, we study, pray and celebrate together. We invite you to join us.

Selichot services this year will be on **Saturday September 4th, 9 PM, at Emanuel**. The program will be led by Rabbi Larry Edwards and Rabbi Michael Zedek of Emanuel.

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services will again be held at JRC, the Jewish Reconstructionist Congregation located at **303 Dodge Ave. in Evanston**.

Tickets are required for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services. Members receive one ticket for individual memberships, two for family memberships. Members may also reserve tickets for their guests at a cost of \$180/ticket. Non-member ticket price is \$250 with a reduced fee of \$180 for those under 30. There is no charge for tickets for fulltime students who present a valid student ID.

We also invite you to join us for our Rosh Hashanah luncheon. The luncheon this year will be held at **Gulliver's, 2727 West Howard**, just a few blocks from the synagogue. **Reservations are required and must be received by September 3rd**. The cost is \$20/person.

Something different this year is that Taschlich will be held not following Rosh Hashanah services, but on Friday evening, September 10th. We will meet on the beach by Emanuel at 7:15, and then continue with Shabbat Shuvah services at 8 PM, also at Emanuel.

We look forward to celebrating the High Holidays together.

For years, Norman Sandfield has been urging our participation in the World Congress of Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Jews: Keshet Ga'avah [Rainbow Pride]. Or Chadash has long been a member, but few of us have been active in the organization. Or Chadash did host the Chicago conference back in 1989, and a meeting of the Executive Board just last year. I myself attended the "Mini-Conference" held during World Pride in Jerusalem in 2006.

I have just returned from the 20th World Congress Conference in Los Angeles, and I am pleased to report that Or Chadash was well-represented. Bill Wahler, whose participation in the Congress goes back to the 10th Conference, Amsterdam 1987, was one of the presenters of a session on the 35-year history of the Congress. Laurie Grauer, Michael Helfgott, and Alan Amberg were there. Also Tina Grossman, and former OC member Warren Rosen. Chicago definitely made its presence known!

The sessions were substantive, the camaraderie palpable, and the entertainment entertaining. Rabbi Lisa Edwards and Cantor Juval Porat of Beth Chayyim Chadashim led a moving service on Friday evening. Sunday afternoon, I attended the ceremonial groundbreaking for BCC's new building, at which Lisa quoted these verses from the haftarah of the week:

Enlarge the site of your tent,
Extend the size of your dwelling,
Do not stint!
Lengthen the ropes, and drive the pegs firm...
Fear not, you shall not be shamed;
Do not cringe, you shall not be disgraced.
For you shall forget
The reproach of your youth...
For He who made you will espouse you... (Isaiah 54:2-5)

How perfect is that? And all against the background of the still unfolding drama of Proposition 8 in the Federal Courts.

You will hear more about the conference in the coming weeks, from me and, I am sure, from our other participants. Meanwhile, we prepare ourselves for a New Year, and there is much to do!
