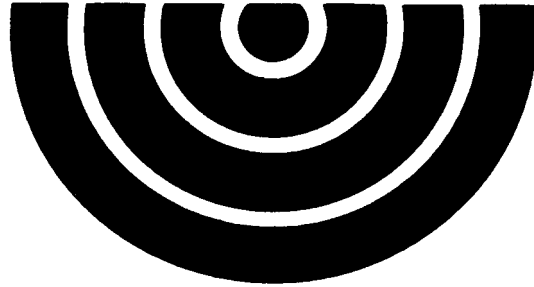

But there is another group of people whose impact is more subtle. One of the great things about Or Chadash, that my lover stated eloquently in a recent devar, is that we don't let each other go. We do ask each other for help, and we provide that help when asked. There were numerous individuals to this year's gala who either paid for others' tickets, or who made donations for scholarships. That cohesive spirit is why we have lasted thirty five years, and should ensure that we last another thirty-five!

I was just interviewed by Michael Anthony, who is producing a film based on his own “It Gets Better” video. <http://forbillythemovie.com/> Michael grew up in Wheeling and has come home from LA to see how things are going. He found out about Or Chadash and wants to know more about institutions that will stand up for LGBTQ youth and stand against bullying.

After Michael posted his video on YouTube he received a letter from a kid named Billy (hence the name of the project). Billy is going through a tough time:

For me high school is not a happy time. I can honestly say that I do not have one real friend. I have friends but they do not know me at all. They do not know the real me. The same for my family and at my job and at my church. I feel like I need to be a certain type of person in order for them to accept me.

But I am not that person. And the more I try to be that person, the more I slowly disappear...

He saw something in Michael’s video that connected with him:

“I wish I had a friend like you in my life right now...”

And Billy ended his letter with a statement that became the theme and motto of Michael’s film project:

“It gave me more than hope. It gave me proof.”

Michael wanted to talk with me about Or Chadash, about what we represent, about what it means to build a religious community that is truly inclusive. I might even say, militantly inclusive.

It is our job to recognize the divine image in every person. It is our job to love the stranger. It is a lot to live up to, and each of us falls short sometimes, I am sure. But by being part of this community, this congregation, we make a statement. By being out, open, affirming, inclusive, we provide a beam of New Light, a beacon of welcome.

We need to raise our profile – not in order to attract new members (though that would be nice), but in order, perhaps, to help save a few lives. Maybe we have already done that, and don’t even know it.

When Passover comes, and we say, “Let all who are hungry come and eat,” let’s think of more than food. Let all who are hungry to be human, to be their best selves, to live a full life, know that they have a place here at our table.
