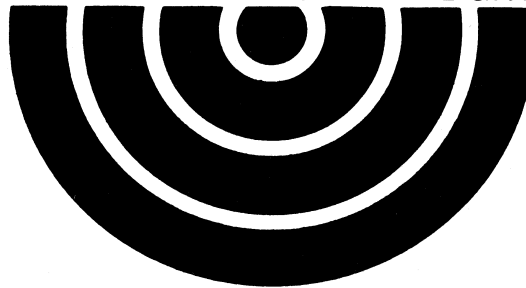

The past year has been difficult for many. There have been job losses, hospital visits, aging parents, shiva minyans. But life is a thick texture, warp and woof tightly woven of both sorrows and joys. So, even though we are at the beginning of the month of Av, associated as it is with various disasters of Jewish history, I want to take note of some reasons to rejoice.

Tradition, after all, refers to Av as Menahem Av – *menahem* is the word for comfort, which comes along with sorrow – and that same tradition suggests that the Messiah will be born on Tisha B'Av. In the very long meanwhile, it is worth noting some reasons for celebration.

Matt Simonette and Dave Morck celebrated their Civil Union on July 31 – the first (of many?) at Or Chadash. Matt and Dave have been around OC as long as I have, and have contributed in many ways to the life of the community – most notably with Matt's edgy Purim Spiels, and Dave's fine service leading (especially on the beach) as well as shofar blowing.

Gerber/Hart Library and Archives Announces Annual Benefit

The annual benefit of Gerber/Hart Library and Archives, "Making History: One Step at a Time," will take place on Saturday, October 1 at 7:00 PM at The Klarchek Information Commons on the campus of Loyola University Chicago. Gerber/Hart will celebrate its 30th anniversary at the event, as well as marking the 25th anniversary of the American Run for the End of AIDS.



The keynote speaker at the event is Brent Nicholson Earle. On March 1, 1986, Earle departed New York City and, for the next twenty months, ran a 9,000-mile journey around the perimeter of the United States. Dubbed "The American Run for the End of AIDS," Earle raised over \$300,000 for AIDS charities. A quarter-century later, the efforts of Earle and his support team stand out as one of the most inspired responses to the AIDS crisis in its early years.

At "Making History: One Step at a Time," Gerber/Hart will initiate the Hugh A. Mathis Unsung Hero Award. The award is named for Hugh Mathis, Gerber/Hart board member who died in January and partner of Or Chadash member, Bill Wahler. The award will be given to one individual, who has not received any other recognition, to acknowledge his or her volunteer activities on behalf of the LGBT community. An application for the Hugh A.
